I hope you all have a wonderful and merry Christmas! May Christ grant you peace, joy, and love!!



Where's the Roast Beast?

Prior to Advent a few years ago, Cathedral Communications Director Sheila Graham and I were discussing the fact that there is no single element known by all as the "Christmas ____ at the Cathedral." Sure, we have the beautiful, giant wreath hanging at the crossing, but that is an Advent icon. We have the nativity set in the Nash Chapel, but that is not, in and of itself, iconic and closely associated with our identity.

We have the Midnight Mass¹, filled with parishioners and visitors, Archbishop, choir, organ, and brass, joyously celebrating the birth of Christ – but that is a beautiful shared experience, not an iconic...thing. There is no single, visual element that everyone in the community associates with the Cathedral at Christmas. We felt like Catholic Grinches², and pondered, "Why don't we have one?"



So we sat, with our churchy-feet ice cold in the snow, puzzling and puzzling, how could it be so? We don't have an icon, no bright yellow star; no living nativity to drive past in your car.

No bright string of lights hung high on the towers; we don't even have frankincense burning for hours. We don't have a thing we can point to and brag; no tall Christmas statue, no waving silk flag. And we puzzled and puzzled 'till our puzzlers were sore. Then we thought of something we hadn't before: What if at Cathedral, perhaps, Christmas means a little bit more?

What if Cathedral, we thought, doesn't need an icon? We've been here a hundred years without one. The miracle is our community gathered as one; at Saint Cecilia, for Christmas, we rejoice in His Son."

We don't need an iconic Christmas element. Not a tree, not a star, not a creche set, nor even a giant wreath. The fact that the message of Christmas: Emmanuel, the miracle that **God is With Us**, is celebrated here, is more than enough. And that miracle occurs every single day, and twice on Sundays, at the Cathedral.

What are the Core Beliefs of the Catholic Faith?

The core beliefs of the Catholic faith are found in the Nicene Creed.

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through Him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation He came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake He was crucified under Pontius Pilate, He suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and His kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

I believe in one, holy, Catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.
