### Celebrating the Santo Niño

The Cofradia del Santo Niño de Cebu - Greater Omaha Chapter is the officially-recognized Catholic religious organization dedicated to spreading the devotion of the Señor Santo Niño in the Nebraska and Omaha metro. The statue of the infant Jesus, or Santo Niño, is the oldest Philippine symbol of Christianity. In 1521, King Philip of Spain had this statue delivered to the queen of Cebu, a city in the Philippines, as a gift for her baptism. Now, the anniversary of this moment is celebrated in Philippine communities around the world.

The celebration occurs at Saint Cecilia Cathedral every January on the third Sunday of the month. The event helps Philippine children learn about their culture, while also inviting anyone who's willing to share in that culture as well. As one mother put it, "It signifies that there is hope and that there's faith and there's love and with the holy infant Jesus, it signifies you know their innocence and that through sharing that and that purity of love is something we value and can learn from." We are very pleased to host this special Mass.

Know Your Faith: Liturgical Objects Used in Church

Paten: The saucer-like dish that holds the main host to be consecrated by the Priest.

**Purificator:** The cloth used to absorb the Precious Blood and wipe the chalice between communicants.

**Pyx:** A small, closing golden vessel that is used to bring the Blessed Sacrament to those who cannot come to the church.
